


## Background on Public Utility Districts and WPUDA




#### 28 PUDs overall

  - Wastewater




## PUD Electric Utility Service in Washington

#### WA Utility Customers, 3.63 Million







## Washington's Low-Income Utility Assistance Mandates

#### The Clean Energy Transformation Act (2019)

- a. Requires electric utilities to fund energy assistance programs for low-income customers
- b. Prioritize low-income households with higher energy burdens
- c. Electric utilities must demonstrate progress in providing assistance

**Goal**: all households at or below 200% of the FPL should not spend more than 6% of their income for (non-transportation) energy services

#### Statutory prohibitions against shut-offs for non-payment

- a. Winter cold (19XX?)
- b. The Preventing Utility Shutoffs for Nonpayment During Extreme Heat Act (SB5366 **2023**)




## Washington's Environmental Justice Mandates

#### **Healthy Environment for All (HEAL) Act – 2021**

- i. WA state departments of Agriculture, Commerce, Ecology, Health, Natural Resources, and Transportation, and the Puget Sound Partnership are to apply Environmental Justice (EJ):
  - i. Agency-specific goals and actions to reduce environmental and health disparities;
  - ii. Metrics to track and measure accomplishments of the agency goals and actions;
  - iii. A plan and methods for equitable public engagement and participation into agency practices;
  - iv. Strategies to ensure compliance with federal and state EJ laws and policies; and
  - v. Specific plans and timelines for incorporating EJ considerations into agency activities
- ii. Established the EJ Council to advise agencies on incorporating EJ into agency activities.
  - i. Prioritized vulnerable populations and overburdened communities
- iii. The Department of Health must maintain and regularly update the Washington Environmental Health Disparities (EHD) Map.





## Limits on Assistance Public Entities May Provide

#### **WA State Constitution**

No county, city, town or other municipal corporation shall hereafter give any money, or property, or loan its money, or credit to or in aid of any individual, association, company or corporation, except for the necessary support of the poor and infirm...

Article VIII, Section 7

### **WA Supreme Court – Okeson**

In invalidating a utility subsidy for streetlighting the WA state Supreme Court stated:

Utilities "lack authority to use ratepayer money for ... [purposes not] ... sufficiently related to the purpose of supplying electricity."


