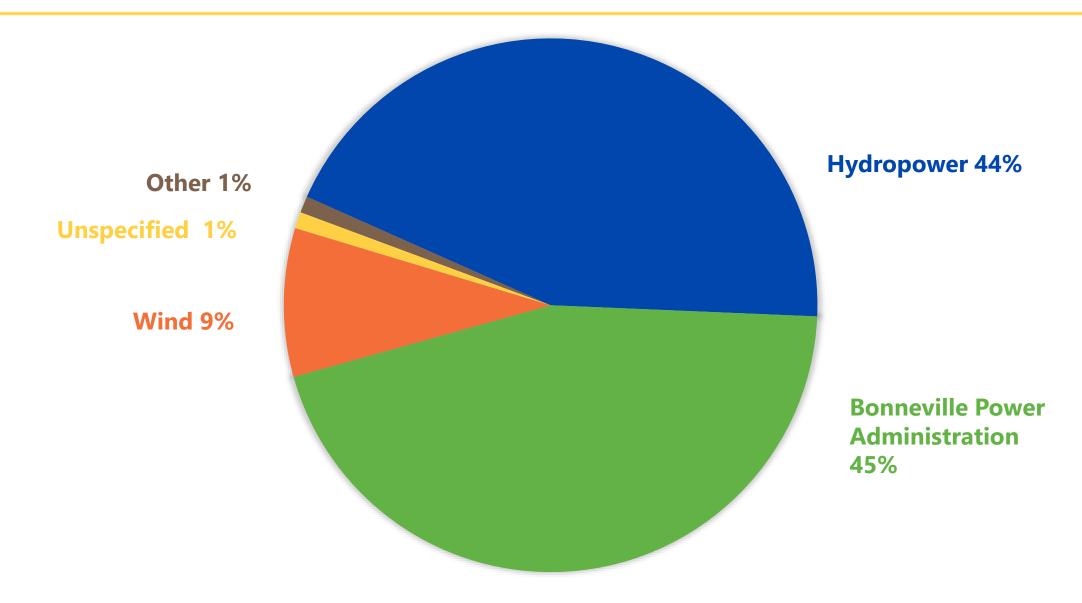

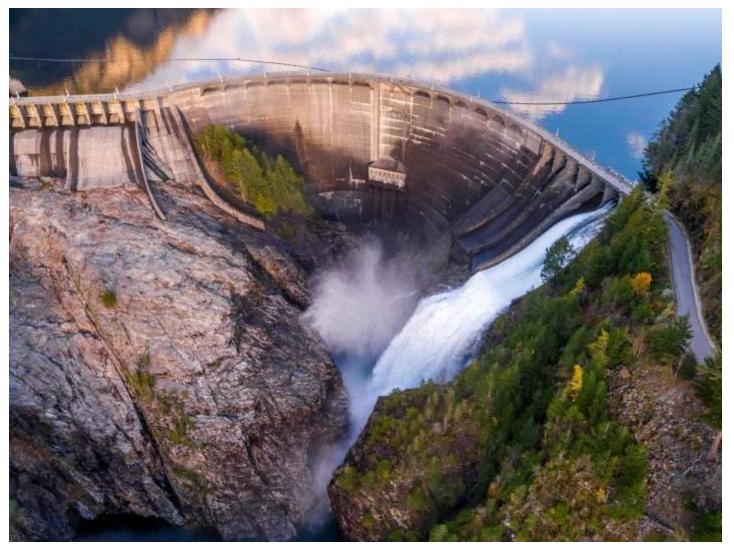

BPA's Customers are Harmed by a Divided West

2026	-\$221 M	-\$165 M	-\$79 M	
2030	-\$215 M	-\$193 M	No analysis	
2035	-\$175 M	-\$216 M	No analysis	

- Markets+ is worse for BPA customers than EDAM by \$165-\$221 million annually; these losses persist indefinitely into the future.
- BPA's decision could increase power costs for City Light's customers by up to \$21 million annually.
